



Bible Study: Romans 8:28-39

Reflect

What has God been teaching you over the past few weeks as we studied Romans 8 together?

Reflecting on the talk from Romans 8:28-39 – what did God say to you? How were you encouraged, challenged? Was there anything you didn't understand?

Fly over - Read Romans 8:28-39

What struck you in this passage? What thoughts and ideas did you or didn't you understand? Discuss.

Digging Deeper

This passage is about God's extravagant love for us. What causes you to ever doubt God's love for you?

What is the good that God wants for us vv.28-29?

How does the idea that God uses all things for our good (v28) and our good is to become more like Jesus (v29) change the way you view the events of your life?

Often our own sin and brokenness is the cause of us feeling that God could no longer love us. How does Paul deal with these doubts in vv. 31-34?

Sometimes the brokenness of the world we live in causes us to doubt God's love for us. How does Paul deal with this issue in vv. 35-37?

What does it mean to be "more than conquerors" in all the seasons of life?

Read and rewrite verses 38-39 as a group.
