



Sharing the Gospel (the good news!)

What is the gospel...and how to share it? The Gospel (good news) comes to us through Jesus of Nazareth, a Rabbi or teacher. But he was more than just a human teacher. He was God. So what is the Gospel and how do we practise sharing the Gospel with others outside the walls of our church building? How do we move from simple to deeper faith based conversations?

'We want to tell our friends about Jesus. We're told that we need to tell our friends about Jesus. But we don't know how to do it. When it comes to evangelism, we are scared and helpless.' Sam Chan¹

It is the Devil's own work to separate the language of salvation from the setting of salvation. To separate words from personal relationships, to make salvation a 'cause' or a 'project' that can be conducted as efficiently and impersonally as possible. But the Gospel won't permit it.' - Eugene Peterson

Defining The Gospel

In Greek, the word is euangelion, literally translated as good news. It is a declaration about Jesus.



Life Shared: Take A Step

Defining, "Who is my neighbor?" and taking practical next steps to sharing the gospel with our neighbors.



Life Shared: Join His Heart

Discussing feelings and thoughts around the idea of sharing your faith in this present culture and context.



Hospitality

For Jesus, sharing the gospel was sharing a meal. Practicing the way of Jesus is shared life around a table, inviting others in.



Life Shared: You're Invited

Partnering with God to bring the Good News to our neighborhoods and cities, through the Spirit's power.



Invitation

One way to preach the gospel is through inviting others to Alpha, a conversation about spirituality without judgement.
